SATISFACTION AND STAFF DEVELOPMENT GET 'A' GRADES!

A recent staff survey has revealed that 73% of staff say they get quite a lot of satisfaction from the job they do at BCH – up 13% from last year's survey – whilst 88% say their contribution to work is recognised and valued (an increase of 36%).

BCH boss Bill Chippington said he was delighted with the outcome of the summer survey.

“Our main function is to satisfy customer needs and I believe we can only achieve this if our staff themselves feel fulfilled and appreciated. Of course there is still a small number who don't feel fully included but that is our challenge over the next year”.

With over 90 per cent of staff saying they could explain how their contribution helps achieve Company objectives, and 80 per cent believes the Company is committed to staff development; the BCH Board expressed its ongoing support for its staff development programme in the new financial year. “We are beginning to understand what works for our staff”, added MD Chippington, “and it important that the Board's commitment is maintained when improvement levels are so substantial”.

The staff survey follows a customer survey, which identified the highest ever levels of customer care and satisfaction with BCH.

BCH Managers are working on increasing participation of staff in decision making processes and improving levels of feedback about staff performance.

“Having objectives is pretty useless if the workforce are not aware of them” said Mr. Chippington with the knowledge that 85 per cent of his staff could explain what BCH is trying to achieve.

PROFILE ON DOUGIE SMITH

When it comes to awarding a title of Mr Commitment, one of the top contenders must be BCH driver Dougie Smith. Now in his 60's, Dougie has built up a reputation for going the extra mile if it keeps the customer satisfied.

Following 8 years shunting at Quebecor, Dougie is a front line ambassador for BCH drivers at their very best. It's great when the company is able to praise its workers for their commitment and flexibility but when the Customer adds their respect, the accolade becomes all the more precious.

When it was time to undertake two years National Service, it seemed only natural that Dougie should join up with the locally based Gordon Highlanders and found himself as part of a peace keeping force in Cyprus between 1954 and 1956 where there was terrorist activity as trouble escalated between Turks and Greeks.

Originally from Aberdeenshire, Dougie moved to Corby with his parents in 1957 with the promise of a new job for Mr Smith senior and a new house for the Smith family. It

was at a period when many of the Scottish steel works, such as Stewart and Lloyds, closed their doors, and many families made a mass exodus towards the 'rainbow' town of Corby.

As a driver with BRS for 38 years at the current BCH Corby site, Dougie moved with them to Northampton for 1 year but couldn't settle. It was then he decided to return to his 'home base', which by his time was now in the hands of BCH Ltd. "It's a great company to work for with a great history of being built up from nothing, said Dougie, "things have changed for the better over the years as the business has built up and Bill has spent a lot of money of new vehicles" Dougie said he loves his job, not only because "it suits me down to the ground" but also because of the people he works with.

Following a shock emergency operation for an aneurism, Dougie has been back at work for the past 7 or so weeks. "It's great to have Dougie back" said BCH boss Bill Chippington. "In addition to being a real professional, he really does radiate job satisfaction through his flexible approach to work accompanied by a radiant personality"
